Church. Towards the end of his life Aquinas experienced a profound vision of God after which he never wrote again, calling earlier writings "mere straw" in comparison with the God who had en-

countered him so powerfully. Our relationship with the Living God matters more than anything, and this gift is ours uniquely in Jesus Christ, who has opened the door to this relationship in His gift on the cross.

One may ask, 'how do I come to know God?' 'What does it mean to give our lives in trust to him?' Which steps must be followed to bring us into relationship with him?'

Please let me respond to these questions. (Or you can seek out a Christ-following friend or church and ask how to trust your life to him.)

Your life will begin to change almost immediately.

The journey begins by recognizing that God is seeking us far more urgently than we are seeking him and has opened a way to know him

We must of course turn from pride to become open to God who is greater than us. It is not our goodness, our best efforts, how much we know or how successful we are that opens the way to knowing God.

You may or may not be conscious of sin which keeps you from God. God however has made a way through this barrier between us and him. No matter what we have done, God has provided forgiveness. There is no such thing as an unpardonable sin. "If we confess our sins, he is just and merciful to forgive our sins and cleanse us from every kind of wrong." (I John 1:9)

You may just simply come. Jesus loves you and invites you to follow him into the presence of Almighty God through the way he has prepared for you.
